

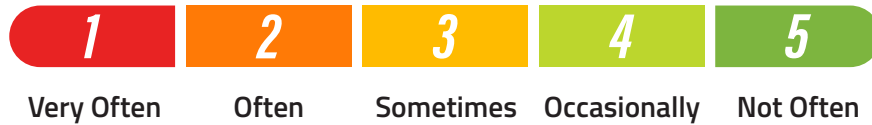

# Behavior Tracking Chart
